The Return Of Maytime Le Jeune, French composer of the 16th century, was a forerunner in writing "measured music," i.e., with definite rhythmic pulsations. With "The Return of Mayrime," the composer seems to have deviated a bit from the usual style of the French "Chanson" of this time, which was usually imitative and polyphonic, though the light character of the words is certainly retained.
